## **BILLING PAYMENT OPTIONS AND EXPLANATIONS**

Financial Settlement is the process of fulfilling your financial obligation each semester.

Late financial settlement: Students that are not financially settled by the deadline may be withdrawn from courses or receive a \$150 late financial settlement fee.

Late registration: Students registering on or after the first day of class will pay a \$150 late registration fee.

There are two payment options available outlined below. You may pay online via the payment system ([HuskyNet](#) under "My Student Account") or at the Student Accounts Office. Online payment options include ACH (electronic check), credit/debit card, and international wire transfer. In-person payment options include cash, check, money order, and credit/debit card.

### **OPTION 1 – PAYMENT IN FULL**

Pay your bill in full by the financial settlement deadline each semester. Students may pay online via the payment system ([HuskyNet](#) under "My Student Account") or at the Student Accounts Office.

### **OPTION 2 – SEMESTER PAYMENT PLANS**

Enroll in a payment plan once you have registered. There is a \$50 payment plan enrollment fee per semester. Payment plans require a 10% down payment. Payment plan payments are automatically drafted on the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. The system will automatically recalculate your plan within 24 hours of any account balance changes. Here are the steps to set-up a payment plan:

Log in [HuskyNet](#)-> Click "My Student Account" under "Additional Links"-> Click "Continue"-> Click on "Enroll in Plan"-> Select semester-> Select desired plan-> Read and follow steps to enroll.

Anyone that is not the student must be listed as FERPA authorized to receive any information regarding a student's accounting records.

## **ADDITIONAL FINANCING OPTIONS**

Online Scholarships – Apply for online scholarships from outside agencies. A list of suggested resources is available on the Office of Financial Aid website.

Federal Work Study – An opportunity to earn wages to help meet the cost of education. The amount a student may earn is determined by financial aid eligibility, the hours worked, and the hourly wage.

Parent PLUS Loans – Available to parents of undergraduate dependent students to help cover educational expenses (up to the student's cost of attendance minus financial aid). HCU will begin accepting PLUS Loan applications June 1. The application can be completed at [StudentAid.gov](http://StudentAid.gov).

Private Loans – Students may apply for a private loan through outside lenders. Lenders may require credit worthy co-signers before final approval. Students may borrow up to the cost of attendance minus financial aid. HCU will begin accepting private loan applications for the 2026-2027 academic year on June 1. A list of lenders HCU frequently works with is available on the OFA website. When applying for a private loan, consider applying with a credit-worthy cosigner to help keep your interest rate lower.
