The Guild Institute hosts Dr. Voddie Baucham '92

The Guild Institute hosted Dr. Voddie Baucham as he lectured at HBU on September 29. At Convocation in Dunham Theater, to a capacity audience, he spoke on the subject *The Lord's Will vs. My Desire*. The scripture text was Genesis 41: the life of Joseph. Speaking about the most God-honoring thing we can do, by utilizing the gifts that God has given us, Dr. Baucham emphasized the preoccupation with wealth, money, and power which influences the way we view life. He also stressed that the greater truth revealed in Joseph's life story is the commitment we should have to serve God for His glory. In conclusion, he told the students that our goal should be to

conform to the image of Jesus Christ.

In the afternoon. Dr. Baucham addressed an audience of approximately 60 parents and students representing the home-school community on the topic of *Opportunities* in Christian Higher Education. 
