### Celebrating Founders Day

The Fall season was packed with activities on the HBU campus that included The Guild. Nearly 700 guests gathered for HBU's recent Spirit of Excellence Gala that honored several Guild members in addition to other University supporters. The glittering event raised nearly \$715K to support the University Center for Law and Liberty, plus the expansion of the University's online academic initiatives. Peggy Noonan, former speechwriter to Ronald Reagan (and currently, best-selling author) delivered a humorous, insightful keynote address launching a highly successful event. The Guild's own Linda Higginbotham and Mary Ann Belin received the President's Award while Robert and Sue Sloan were given the Spirit of Excellence Award.

Other fundraising initiatives were updated by Underwriting Chairs Jennifer and Tadd Tellepsen. Archie Dunham was recognized for the largest single gift ever given to the University; Pinky Pampell was recognized for a catalyst gift designated to expand the University's online program; and Dr. Sloan announced that the University is nearing the halfway mark of achieving its capital campaign goal of \$136.5 Million.

Gala Chairs Beth and Greg Looser did a spectacular job to ensure that a first class evening was enjoyed by all.
