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## Profile of Transfer Students Fall 2008 and Fall 2009

This report contains demographic and academic information for transfer students who entered the University in Fall 2008 and Fall 2009. Information is included on:

#### Fall 2009

The transfer students of Fall 2009 include 236 students who entered the University in Summer 2009 or Fall 2009. Selected demographic information for this group of transfer students indicate that 69% (163) are female, and that 64.4% (152) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up 29.7% (70) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 223 (95.7%) have Texas as their state of permanent address. Eightynine percent of the students are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a SAT or ACT score, the transfer class had a mean score of 964 for the SAT and 20 for the ACT examination. Approximately 30% of students declared a major in Nursing, while 14% declared Business or Business Administration and 10% Psychology.

#### Fall 2008

The transfer students of Fall 2008 include 252 students who entered the University in Summer 2008 or Fall 2008. Selected demographic information for this group of transfer students indicate that 69% (173) are female, and that 64.3% (162) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up 33% (82) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 233 (93.5%) have Texas as their state of permanent address. Eightynine percent of the students are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a SAT or ACT score, the transfer class had a mean score of 1014 for the SAT and 20 for the ACT examination. Approximately 31% of students declared a major in Nursing, while 15% declared Biology, and 11% Business Administration.

#### **Test Score Calculations**

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, only one score is counted. The ACT score is converted into the equivalent SAT score and compared to the actual SAT score, and only the higher is retained. Additionally, for students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math sub-scores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
