UPDATED Profile of New Freshmen Fall 2006 and Fall 2007

Fall 2007

The freshmen class of Fall 2007 includes 456 students who entered the University in Summer 2007 or Fall 2007. Demographically, sixty-six percent (303) of the new freshmen are female, and 61.8 percent (282) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up thirty-four percent (34.2%) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 436 (97.5%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 40 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria county make up 81.7% of the class. Ninety percent of the class are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, forty-seven percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The class had a mean score of 1084 for the SAT and 22 for the ACT examination. Approximately 29 percent of students declared a major in Biology, while 15 percent declared Nursing and 13 percent Business Administration.

Fall 2006¹

The freshmen class of Fall 2006 includes 261 students who entered the University in Summer 2006 or Fall 2006. Demographically, sixty-three percent (164) of the new freshmen are female, and 57.5 percent (150) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up approximately thirty-nine percent (38.7%) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 255 (98.5%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 14 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria county make up 89.4% of the class. Ninety percent of the class are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, forty-three percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The class had a mean score of 1080 for the SAT and 22 for the ACT examination. Approximately 27 percent of students declared a major in Biology, while 20 percent declared Chemistry and 17 percent Nursing.

1. Fall 2006 data was pulled from data frozen on the census date in Fall 2006, and did not undergo the same data quality checks and cleansing as data from Fall 2007. This includes reconciliation of student numbers from Recruitment PLUS to Banner.

Test Score Calculations

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, only one score is counted. The ACT score is converted into the equivalent SAT score and compared to the actual SAT score, and only the higher is retained. Additionally, for students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math subscores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score. For Fall 2006, this procedure resulted in an increase of approximately 6 points on the average SAT score, from 1074 to 1080.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
