#### Fall 2007

The undergraduate enrollment of 1,992 includes 456 new freshmen and 273 new transfer students for Fall 2007. There are 31 students classified as Post-Baccalaureate or Non-Degree Seeking. Demographically, sixty-seven percent (1,325) of the undergraduates are female, and fifty-six percent (1,115) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up approximately thirty-five percent (34.5%) of undergraduates.

For students with known addresses, 1,935 (98.3%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 65 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria county make up 88.5% of undergraduates. Ninety percent are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, forty-seven percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The mean score for undergraduates for the SAT is 1100 and 22 for the ACT examination.

#### **Fall 2006<sup>1</sup>**

The undergraduate enrollment of 1,815 includes 262 new freshmen and 270 new transfer students for Fall 2006. There are 37 students classified as Post-Baccalaureate or Non-Degree Seeking. Demographically, sixty-seven percent (1,213) of the undergraduates are female, and fifty-two percent (936) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up approximately thirty-three percent (33.2%) of undergraduates.

For students with known addresses, 1,760 (97.0%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 44 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria county make up 91.5% of undergraduates. Ninety-two percent are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, forty-seven percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The mean score for undergraduates for the SAT is 1108 and 22 for the ACT examination.

1. Fall 2006 data was pulled from data frozen on the census date in Fall 2006, and did not undergo the same data quality checks and cleansing as data from Fall 2007. This includes reconciliation of student numbers from Recruitment PLUS to Banner.

#### **Test Score Calculations**

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, only one score is counted. The ACT score is converted into the equivalent SAT score and compared to the actual SAT score, and only the higher is retained. Additionally, for students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math subscores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
