Fall 2007

The transfer students of Fall 2007 include 273 students who entered the University in Summer 2007 or Fall 2007. Demographically, seventy percent (192) of the transfer students are female, and 63.7 percent (174) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up thirty-seven percent (36.6%) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 260 (95.5%) have Texas as their state of permanent address. Eighty-three percent of the students are U.S. citizens.

Among student who reported a SAT or ACT score, the class had a mean score of 1056 for the SAT and 20 for the ACT examination. Approximately 25 percent of students declared a major in Nursing, while 17 percent declared Business Administration and 14 percent Biology.

Fall 2006¹

The transfer students of Fall 2006 include 270 students who entered the University in Summer 2006 or Fall 2006. Demographically, seventy percent (190) of the transfer students are female, and 54.8 percent (148) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up approximately thirty-three percent (32.6%) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 254 (98.4%) have Texas as their state of permanent address. Eighty-five percent of the students are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a SAT or ACT score, the mean score was 1058 for the SAT and 21 for the ACT examination. Approximately 31 percent of students declared a major in Nursing, while 14 percent declared Biology and 14 percent Business Administration.

^{1.} Fall 2006 data was pulled from data frozen on the census date in Fall 2006, and did not undergo the same data quality checks and cleansing as data from Fall 2007. This includes reconciliation of student numbers from Recruitment PLUS to Banner.

Test Score Calculations

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, only one score is counted. The ACT score is converted into the equivalent SAT score and compared to the actual SAT score, and only the higher is retained. Additionally, for students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math subscores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
