Fall 2016

The freshmen class of Fall 2016 includes 577 students who entered the University in Summer 2016 or Fall 2016. Demographically, just over sixty percent (348) of the new freshmen are female, and 74.2% (428) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up 23.2% of the group, a slight decrease from last year.

For students with known addresses, 552 (95.7%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 45 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria counties make up 77.9% of the class, about the same as last year.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, fifty-five percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The class had a mean score of 1046 for the SAT and 23 for the ACT examination. Twenty percent of students declared a major in Nursing, while 4 percent were undecided.

Fall 2015

The freshmen class of Fall 2015 includes 545 students who entered the University in Summer 2015 or Fall 2015. Demographically, just over sixty percent (338) of the new freshmen are female, and sixty-eight percent (374) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-six percent (26.8%) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 527 (96.7%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 53 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria counties make up 77.0% of the class.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, fifty-five percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The class had a mean score of 1061 for the SAT and 23 for the ACT examination. Nineteen percent of students declared a major in Nursing and Biology, while nearly 6 percent were undecided.

Test Score Calculations

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, both scores are reported. Additionally, for students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math subscores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score. For Fall 2006, this procedure resulted in an increase of approximately 6 points on the average SAT score, from 1074 to 1080.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
