Fall 2016

The undergraduate enrollment of 2,332 includes 577 new freshmen and 236 new transfer students for Fall 2016. Demographically, sixty-two percent (1,457) of the undergraduates are female, and 68.3% (1,592) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-four percent of undergraduates.

For students with known addresses, 2,229 (95.6%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 82 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria counties make up 79.6% of undergraduates.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, sixty percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The mean score for undergraduates for the SAT is 1064 and 23 for the ACT examination. Approximately 22% of undergraduates have declared a major in Nursing, while an additional 12% have declared Biology and six percent Psychology and Kinesiology – Wellness Management.

Fall 2015

The undergraduate enrollment of 2,250 includes 545 new freshmen and 200 new transfer students for Fall 2015. Demographically, sixty-one percent (1,376) of the undergraduates are female, and two-thirds (1,524) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-four percent of undergraduates.

For students with known addresses, 2,141 (95.2%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 80 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria counties make up 80.8% of undergraduates.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, sixty-one percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The mean score for undergraduates for the SAT is 1075 and 23 for the ACT examination. Approximately 19% of undergraduates have declared a major in Nursing, while an additional 12% have declared Biology and six percent Psychology and Kinesiology – Wellness Management.

Test Score Calculations

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, both scores are reported. For students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math subscores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
