Fall 2016

The transfer students of Fall 2016 included 236 students who entered the University in Summer 2016 or Fall 2016. Demographically, sixty-eight percent (161) of the new transfer students are female, and sixty-six percent (157) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-one percent (49) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 222 (94.1%) have Texas as their state of permanent address. Ninety percent of the students are U.S. citizens. Sixty-seven percent transferred from Texas colleges, with 16% coming from an in-state four year institution and 51% from an in-state two year school.

Among students who reported a SAT or ACT score, the transfer class had a mean score of 989 for the SAT and 21 for the ACT examination (less than 20% of the transfers had a standardized test score). Forty-three percent of students declared a major in Nursing, while 8.5% declared Biology and 4.2% declared Psychology.

Fall 2015

The transfer students of Fall 2015 included 200 students who entered the University in Summer 2015 or Fall 2015. Demographically, sixty-two percent (124) of the new transfer students are female, and seventy-two percent (144) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up nineteen percent (37) of the group.

For students with known addresses, 180 (90.0%) have Texas as their state of permanent address. Ninety percent of the students are U.S. citizens. Sixty percent transferred from Texas colleges, with 15% coming from an in-state four year institution and 45% from an in-state two year school.

Among students who reported a SAT or ACT score, the transfer class had a mean score of 969 for the SAT and 22 for the ACT examination (less than 25% of the transfers had a standardized test score). Twenty percent of students declared a major in Nursing, while 8.5% declared Psychology and 8% declared Elementary Education with Special Education.

Test Score Calculations

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, both scores are reported. For students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math sub-scores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
