

Doctor of Ministry (DMin) New Testament Track 2026-2027 Official Degree Plan



Degree Requirements

(all courses required for degree must be completed with "C" or higher)

COURSES	HOURS
Students who enter with sufficient graduate theological education, as determined by their academic advisor—including courses in Hermeneutics, Systematic Theology, Church History, New Testament Theology, and Old Testament Theology—may be granted advanced standing and complete the degree in 30 hours. Students not granted advanced standing may be required to complete up to 18 hours of graduate theological coursework, the exact makeup to be determined by their advisor. In addition, all students must demonstrate competency in Greek as a graduation requirement, either through coursework or other means as determined by their advisor.	0-18
