## >>> IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### ☐ FERPA

FERPA is short for the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Among many other topics, FERPA gives college students 18 and over the right to decide who has access to their educational records. The FERPA Release Form must be completed if you would like your parents to be able to discuss financial matters and clear financial aid during GO without your presence. In addition, you have the ability to select what type of information that you would like your parents to be able to access (academic, financial, etc.). FERPA is enforced by the U.S. Department of Education.

#### ☐ MENINGITIS

You must submit the enclosed HCU Meningitis Vaccine Form and proof of vaccination or waiver at or before your GO session. Texas law mandates that all new college students under the age of twenty-two (22) have the Meningitis Vaccine within the last 5 years. This means you are not allowed to attend classes or live on campus until sufficient proof has been received by the university at least 10 days prior to move-in or first day of classes.

#### ☐ TRANSCRIPTS/TEST SCORES

You are required to submit your final high school transcript stating your graduation date by **August 1st**. It can be sent by the school directly to The Office of Admissions, or you can bring it in a sealed envelope to your GO session. In addition, if you have completed

any dual credit courses either through your high school or on a college campus, you must submit the final transcript showing all completed courses from the college. Lastly, if you took any AP, CLEP, CLT, or IB exams, your official scores must be submitted to HCU in order to be reviewed for credit.

#### ☐ MATH PLACEMENT 2023

Do you have AP/IB or Dual Credit for math? Is your major **Business, Mathematics, Science, Engineering, Nursing** or **Undecided**? If so, please be sure to submit your scores and transcripts so your credit may be given before class registration.

If you don't have credit mentioned above, you must take the ALEKS math placement assessment in order to be placed into a mathematics course. As a reminder, SAT and ACT scores cannot be used for placement into MATH 1313 (College Algebra).

If your major is not listed above, and you have a MATH SAT score of 530 or higher or an ACT MATH score of 22 or higher, you may register for MATH 1305. If you don't have these scores, you must take the ALEKS math placement. Visit hc.edu/GO for more details.


#### ☐ ENGLISH PLACEMENT

The first English course on all degree plans is ENGL 1313: Composition I. However, if a student does not meet one of the prerequisites for ENGL 1313, they must take ENGL 1303: Basic Grammar and Composition and pass it before taking ENGL 1313. Traditionally, only SAT and ACT scores have been used for placement. However, with students choosing "Test Optional" this year, additional placement options have been added. Below are the prerequisites for ENGL 1313. If a student meets ANY ONE of these requirements, they are eligible to enroll in ENGL 1313.

For Placement into ENGL 1313:

- SAT EBRW (Evidence Based Reading and Writing) Score of 570+
- ACT English Score of 22+
- · CLT (Classical Learning Test) Total Score of 75+
- Student earned a "B" (or higher) final grade in AP, IB High Level, or Honors English on their high school transcript
- Student earned an "A" in their SENIOR year English Course on their high school transcript
- Accuplacer Next Gen Reading score of 253+ AND a Writing Score of 253+ or and a WritePlacer Score of 5+
- TSIA Reading Score of 351+ AND Writing Score of 340+ AND Essay Score of 5+
- TSIA2 score of 945+ on the ELAR CRC (English Language Arts and Reading Section of the College Readiness Classification)
   Test AND an Essay score of 5+
- Transfer credit for ENGL 1303

If a student does not meet any of the above requirements, they may enroll in ENGL 1303, or they may sign up to take the Accuplacer Next Gen exam. The exam is offered on HCU's campus and must be taken in-person. The cost of the **exam is \$25** and students can register at **hc.edu/testing**.



#### ☐ CLASS SCHEDULE

Each student who has not previously registered for classes will have the opportunity to meet with an Academic Advisor to select a class schedule. You will have the opportunity to view your schedule after you have completed class registration in the computer lab rotation at GO. If you have submitted dual credit or AP/IB credit in advance, it will be taken into consideration when meeting with your academic advisor.

#### ☐ TUITION & PAYMENTS

Everyone will have the opportunity to meet one-on-one with one of our financial aid representatives during GO to ensure you and your family are prepared to pay for college. You are not required to make a payment at GO. However, you will have several options to assist in the payment process including: registering for a payment plan and applying for loans. If you have not completed a FAFSA, please do so prior to Orientation.

Please complete the following forms within this packet, and submit them to the Admission's table once you arrive at GO during check - in. If you are under the age of 18, please have your parent sign the forms.

#### WHERE TO STAY

FRESHMAN: All incoming students will be staying in the Freshman Village residence halls on campus. All students attending a 2-Day Freshmen Orientation MUST spend the night at orientation. #### SUMMER LAUNCH: JULY 10TH - 13TH





## >>> EXEMPTIONS

An exemption is defined as a justifiable excuse, with documentation, to not attend an in-person orientation date. All incoming students are **required** to attend in-person orientation unless the student has an exemption request approved by the Office of Admissions. Please see below for information on requesting an exemption. The orientation matriculation fee is **non-refundable** even if a student is unable to attend in person.

Exemptions from an in-person orientation:
Students can request an exemption from attending an inperson New Student Orientation under certain circumstances.
All exemptions will be reviewed and granted on a case-by-case
basis. To request an exemption, at least one of the following
must apply\*:

- 1. Students will be completing an online—only degree program.
- Student will be a non-degree seeking or transient student, AND is not planning to transition to a degree seeking student.
- 3. Students have a documented medical condition spanning the entirety of the offered orientation dates, which prevents them from attending any in-person orientation date.

All students interested in requesting an exemption must email <u>GO@hbu.edu</u> with a subject line containing their legal name, H number, and EXEMPTION.

\*Students in these exemption categories will be required to provide documentation and complete alternate orientation.

# OVERNIGHT EXEMPTIONS AND ACCOMMODATIONS:

Students can request an exemption from spending the night at a New Student Orientation or request overnight accommodation under certain circumstances. All requests will be reviewed and granted on a case-by-case basis. To request an exemption or accommodation, at least one of the following must apply:

- 1. Students have documented medical conditions prohibiting them from staying overnight in the residence hall.
- 2. Student's religious beliefs do not allow them to stay overnight in the residence hall.

All students interested in requesting an exemption or needing accommodation must email go@hbu.edu with a subject line containing their legal name, H number, and OVERNIGHT EXEMPTION.

### >>> DISTANCE ADVISING

Distance Advising is available to students who are unable to attend an in-person orientation before their intended semester of enrollment. All requests for Distance Advising will be reviewed and granted with proof of one of the following circumstances. Students being advised at a distance must attend a virtual orientation.

- 1. Student lives outside a 250-mile radius of HCU (Houston Christian University)
- 2. You have an already booked trip during ALL orientation session dates.

All students who request Distance Advising must show documentation to confirm their inability to attend an in-person orientation. Acceptable forms of documentation include address confirmation, a confirmed airline ticket, and rental car confirmation.

All students interested in requesting Distance Advising must register for distance advising through the email sent after depositing.

\*We reserve the right to deny a student's Distance Advising for orientation without sufficient documentation of need.




#### **?** IS THERE A FEE FOR GUESTS?

Yes, there is an \$8 fee for guests attending Freshmen Orientation who will eat lunch with you here on campus. The preferred method of payment is cash or credit card.

#### ② CAN I BRING MY FRIEND/ SIBLING/FAMILY MEMBER WITH ME TO GO?

Parents and guardians are welcome at all orientations and, if attending, will follow a separate schedule of events for some sessions. Because of the nature of the program, it is not appropriate for anyone except parents/guardians or spouses to attend as a guest. If a friend or sibling accompanies you, they must follow the Family & Guest programming schedule. No guests under the age of 18 can follow the Family & Guest programming schedule.

The exception would be an older sibling who is acting in a guardian capacity; however, in this case, the sibling would attend the Family & Guest Orientation and would not be with you during any time parents and students are not ordinarily together.
