STEPS TO TRANSFER TO HCU

1. Complete the free transfer application at [HC.edu/Apply](https://hcu.edu/apply), applytexas.org or commonapp.org
2. Submit official transcripts and any AP, IB or CLEP scores from each previously attended college or university
3. Complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov
4. Receive your admission decision two to three weeks after HCU receives your application and transcripts
5. Submit your meningitis vaccination documents (for students under 22 years of age)
6. Automatically receive one of HCU's transfer scholarships for students with a 2.0 cumulative GPA or higher
7. Receive your official Progress Toward Degree document explaining your transferable credits within two weeks of admission.
8. Schedule a financial aid appointment at [HC.edu/Appointment](https://hcu.edu/appointment)
9. Deposit at [HC.edu/Deposit](https://hcu.edu/deposit)
10. Sign up for Pre-Registration or Transfer Get Oriented (GO) where you will be advised and register for your classes
11. Fill out a housing application by visiting [HC.edu/Housing](https://hcu.edu/housing)

Transferring to HCU

HCU TRANSFER BASICS

- 120 – 125 credit hours with no less than 25% of the required hours being earned at HCU including at least 12 semester hours of upper-level courses in the major
- 40-43 credit hours of the Liberal Arts Core Curriculum (See page 7)
- Prior approval must be obtained for any courses taken at another college after you become an HCU student
- HCU will not transfer or accept courses with a grade of D or F
- Once you have earned at least 64 hours that apply to your chosen degree, work with your faculty advisor to file a degree plan
- 2.00 GPA with no grade below C in major-required courses in order to graduate
- Freshman Year Seminar, FYS 1300, is required of all students who enter with fewer than 32 semester hours of credit
- Math - If you have not transferred your core math requirement into HCU, you may be required to take the ALEKS test for math placement
- No more than six semester hours in kinesiology activity courses and no more than four semester hours of other student activity courses will count as elective credit toward the number of hours required for any undergraduate degree

TEXAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE GUARANTEE

Houston Christian University has recently announced guaranteed admission for students who have completed an associate degree at a community college in Texas. HCU partners with seven Texas community colleges and is working on adding more.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?

If you've earned an associate degree from a community college in Texas, HCU will guarantee your admission if you meet our minimum grade requirements.

Your Liberal Arts Core is Complete

HCU will consider the general education component of the undergraduate curriculum complete (approximately 37 credit hours). Exclusions include the required religion courses and any unmet pre-requisite course requirements specific to your major not taken at your community college. POST-BACCALAUREATE STUDENT ADMISSION

To be considered for post-Baccalaureate admission, a student must have earned a 4-year undergraduate degree from a regionally accredited institution and seeking to enroll in undergraduate courses for personal edification or certification. Credit awarded will not be applied toward a graduate degree and may not be changed to graduate credit. A post-Baccalaureate student may seek a second bachelor degree. All candidates wishing to obtain a second bachelor degree must apply for post-baccalaureate degree seeking status and may be eligible for financial aid. A post-baccalaureate student not seeking a second bachelor degree is not eligible for financial aid. Post-Baccalaureate and online students are not eligible for transfer merit awards. Transfer merit awards are applied only to the fall and spring.

REQUIRED MATERIALS:

- ☐ A post-Baccalaureate student seeking a degree at HCU must submit official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended. If not seeking another undergraduate degree at HCU, the final transcript from the degree-granting institution will suffice.


GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

HCU requires attendance at on-campus spiritual formation events to graduate. All students seeking an undergraduate degree must complete the 80 CLW credit requirement before graduation. A minimum of 50 CLW-A credits must be earned through attendance at Convocation. Students can also earn a maximum of 30 CLW-B credits by participating in a variety of HCU sponsored spiritual formation events such as mission trips and small groups. Transfer students are credited CLW credits with a simple formula: hours transferred in multiplied by $\frac{3}{4}$ = CLW credit. For example, if you transfer in 40 credit hours, 30 CLW credits will be applied. Students are highly encouraged to earn a minimum of 15 CLW credits per semester; however, students may earn as many CLW credits per semester as their schedule allows until the full spiritual life requirement has been met before graduation..

GPA CALCULATION

- Excludes remedial and developmental courses
- Excludes courses repeated at the same institution
- Grade scales using +/- are converted; for example, B- converts to B (3.0)
- GPAs are combined from each previously attended institution
- Science and math courses taken more than seven years ago are not transferable for science majors
- Ds and Fs are nontransferable but do count towards your cumulative admissions GPA

Orientation and Class Registration

PRE-REGISTRATION EVENT

Ready to get a jump start on your fall class schedule? Pre-registration opens in early November for the spring semester and in March for the summer and fall semesters. Hear from your academic college, meet with your advisor and register for classes. This event is optional and open to all new incoming transfer students.

AM I READY FOR PRE-REGISTRATION*?

If you have completed the following two items, you may sign up for Pre-registration:

- Applied and been accepted to HCU as a transfer student
- Your enrollment deposit is paid.

**Transfer students who attend Pre-Registration are NOT required to attend Transfer Get Oriented (GO).*

GET ORIENTED (GO)

Register for classes, meet with an advisor and finalize all the details before starting classes. Transfer GO is **mandatory** for new incoming transfer or students who have not attended Pre-registration.

DISTANCE ADVISING

If you live 250 miles or more from HCU, you are eligible to participate in distance advising. You will be advised over the phone or Zoom. Please indicate distance advising is desired on your orientation registration form. Our academic advising office will contact you to schedule an appointment.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

A new full-time transfer who has 15 hours after high school graduation will be considered for the following transfer awards.

PROVOST'S SCHOLARSHIP	\$18,000 / academic yr	3.5-4.0 cumulative transfer grade point average
DEAN'S SCHOLARSHIP	\$16,000 / academic yr	3.0-3.49 cumulative transfer grade point average
TRANSFER GRANT I	\$12,000 / academic yr	2.5-2.99 cumulative transfer grade point average
TRANSFER GRANT II	\$8,000 / academic yr	2.0-2.499 cumulative transfer grade point average
PHI THETA KAPPA SCHOLARSHIP	\$3,000 / academic yr	Member in good standing with Phi Theta Kappa as a new HCU transfer student. The scholarship is stackable on top of the Provost's, Dean's, or Transfer Grants.

RENEWAL OF TRANSFER MERIT AWARDS

Recipients of the Provost's Scholarship and Phi Theta Kappa are expected to maintain a 3.0 cumulative HCU grade point average and full-time enrollment. Recipients of the Dean's Scholarship or Transfer Grant are expected to maintain a 2.5 cumulative HCU grade point average and full-time enrollment. HOW WILL MY CREDITS TRANSFER

PROGRESS TOWARD DEGREE (PTD)

The number one question transfer students ask is, “How will my credits transfer?” Within two weeks of admission, you will receive an e-mail with your **Progress Toward Degree (PTD)**, which shows you exactly how your coursework taken at other schools applies toward degree completion at HCU.

**Students transferring less than 45 hours to HCU are required to take CHRI 1301 & 2373. Students transferring more than 45 hours are required to take CHRI 3300 only.*

ADDITIONAL NURSING APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Complete these steps by April 30 to be considered for the fall nursing application or by September 30 for the spring nursing application. **IN ORDER TO MEET THE NURSING DEADLINE, YOU MUST ATTAIN ACCEPTANCE TO THE UNIVERSITY BY MARCH 15 FOR THE FALL PROGRAM OR SEPTEMBER 15 FOR THE SPRING PROGRAM.**

You must be accepted through HCU's general admission process:

- **Finished Liberal Arts Core** and additional nursing pre-requirements (or be currently enrolled in remaining courses at the time of nursing application submission)
- **Students may take either the TEAS or the HESI A2 exam.** Submit your TEAS or HESI exam scores to the School of Nursing and Allied Health

TEAS REQUIREMENTS

A minimum score of 75% in each of the following sections is required*:

ENGLISH AND LANGUAGE USAGE	>75%
MATH	>75%
READING	>75%
SCIENCE (PROFICIENT RANGE)*	>58.7%

Only two attempts are allowed to achieve the minimum score. The second attempt must be at least 14 days after the first exam. A student's exam scores will not be considered if:

- Retesting occurs in less than 14 days
- Exam is taken more than twice, regardless of scores or testing location
- Scores are older than three years

HESI A2 REQUIREMENTS

A minimum score of 85% in each of the following sections (no Critical Thinking) is required:

GRAMMAR	>85%
MATH	>85%
READING	>85%
ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY	>85%

NURSING PROGRAM GPA REQUIREMENTS

- 3.0 cumulative for admission
- 3.0 cumulative for required sciences: Anatomy and Physiology I & II, Introduction to Microbiology, and Introduction to Chemistry
- Students who have received more than two grades of D or F in the required science courses, or more than one D or F in a nursing course are not eligible to apply to HCU's nursing program.
- If the student has been in a nursing program at another institution, a letter of good standing is required.



HOUSING

THE BENEFITS OF RESIDING ON CAMPUS ARE ABUNDANT, and research shows that students who live on campus have a more productive and ultimately more satisfying college experience. That is why, at HCU, you will find a campus that is also a thriving community— one that fosters collaboration, friendship and spiritual development.



HCU'S RESIDENCES MAKE ACCLIMATING TO COLLEGE LIFE **EASY**.

Aside from providing students with a safe and affordable place to live close to their classes and campus amenities, they put students together in one place, making it easy to form new friendships, get involved in different events and organizations, and take part in study groups. They also help students to grow spiritually, develop interpersonal skills, learn about diverse cultures and become more self-disciplined, all while in a community of friends, peers and mentors. **At HCU, we realize that not all students want the same thing when it comes to housing**, so we offer a variety of different options, including residence colleges, student

apartments and living-learning communities. Because of HCU's commitment to the residential experience, students are required to live on campus unless one or more of the following exceptions apply:

- Students who have completed 64 credits prior to the beginning of the entering semester
- Married students
- Graduate students
- Part-time students
- Students living at home with parents or legal guardian
- 21 years of age prior to September 1 of the entering year

STUDENTS WITH LESS THAN 64 CREDIT HOURS MUST COMPLETE A HOUSING APPLICATION AFTER SUBMITTING THEIR DEPOSIT. COMMUTER LIFE

Houston Commuters are a valued part of our HCU community! VETERANS

VETERANS TRANSFERABLE CREDIT HOURS

Each service member will receive at least three hours of elective credit for basic training as documented on the Joint Services Transcript (JST) and may receive up to 30 elective credits for military service as recommended by the American Council of Education (ACE) Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Services and in accordance with HCU policies regarding transfer credits. ACE continuously evaluates military school courses and occupations and recommends courses for college level credit. ACE credit recommendations appear on the JST for military service members. Based on the evaluation, credit may also be applied toward specific degree requirements where appropriate, including any credit for passing Dantes Subject Standardized Tests that have been reviewed and approved by the academic department. Courses from other accredited institutions will still be eligible to receive transfer credits.

HUSKY VETERAN ASSOCIATION

My favorite memory is when we celebrated the beach volleyball team after they won the conference tournament. I also love getting to play baseball every day and hanging out with my buddies.”







INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER STUDENTS

Wherever you may be from, chances are you will feel at home at HCU! The university has a diverse student population from many different cultural and religious backgrounds and from 40 different countries. Interested in learning more? Visit [HC.edu/International](https://hcu.edu/International).

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Excludes remedial and developmental courses
- If you have less than 32 hours, you may be asked to send in a high school transcript evaluation (see Transcript Evaluation below).
- Please note that all college-level classes taken outside the U.S. will transfer to HCU on a case-by-case basis. If you would like a class taken abroad to count towards your HCU degree, you must petition separately for each class with the academic department. If you are planning to seek equivalent course credit for any classes taken abroad, you must provide course descriptions / syllabi for each class. These descriptions must come from your educational institutions and must be in English.
- There is no guarantee that the academic department will award HCU equivalent credit, even with course descriptions.



1. TRANSFER APPLICANTS COMING FROM OUTSIDE THE U.S. (F-1 VISA)

If you are a current university/college student applying as an international transfer student to HCU, please submit the following supplements for your application after completing the transfer application at [HC.edu/Apply](https://hcu.edu/Apply):

- Transcript evaluation of all courses taken outside the U.S.
- Proof of English proficiency
- Copy of your passport (valid 6 months in the future)
- Financial documentation

2. TRANSFER APPLICANTS COMING FROM A U.S. COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY (F-1 VISA)

If you are a current university/college student in the U.S. applying as an F-1 international transfer student to HCU, please submit the following supplements for your application after completing the transfer application at [HC.edu/Apply](https://hcu.edu/Apply):

- ALL college transcripts (any college courses taken outside the U.S. must have a foreign transcript evaluation)
- Copy of your passport, visa, I-94 and I-20
- Transfer in form

- Financial documentation
- Proof of English proficiency (two semesters of English courses equivalent to Composition I and II from a regionally accredited institution of higher education with a grade of C or better can be counted toward English proficiency)

3. TRANSFER APPLICANTS COMING FROM A U.S. COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY (NON F-1 VISA)

If you are a current university/college student in the U.S. applying as an international transfer student to HCU and hold a valid visa other than F-1, please submit the following supplements for your application after completing the transfer application at [HC.edu/Apply](https://hcu.edu/Apply):

- Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended
- Copies of passport, visa, I-94 and approval notice (I-797)

4. UNDOCUMENTED

If you are a student who is undocumented in the U.S., you do not need to submit any supplemental materials other than the application for admissions and the academic transfer requirements listed above.

FOR CURRENT OR F-1 SEEKING STUDENTS

International students must submit documentation verifying financial support — a completed financial affidavit with a witness certifying the signature of the person providing the support. The amount of support that should be written on the financial affidavit for a single person is the estimated yearly academic expenses per program (search “estimated cost” on the HCU website, or go to HC.edu/Student-Accounts/cost-of-attendance). If the student’s dependents will travel to the U.S. with the student, add an additional \$5,000* for each dependent for one year to the specific program amount. Include a copy of the bank account (for three of the last six months) of the person providing the support or a letter from a bank confirming the required funds are available to the student while studying in the U.S.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

Holders of F-1 student visas will be required to demonstrate English proficiency in one of the following ways:

- SAT/ACT
- TOEFL or IELTS
- Duolingo 105
- Successful completion of English Composition I and II from a regionally accredited institution(s)
- Successful completion of the English Language Program at a partner institution
- Completion of a bachelor’s degree or higher from a university whose instruction was conducted in English
- Graduation from an accredited international school or U.S. high school whose curriculum is taught fully in English



HEALTH INSURANCE

All undergraduate and F-1 seeking graduate international students are required to have medical insurance which covers services in Houston, Texas. Their coverage should include repatriation and medical evacuation, an ID card in English, and a claims submission address in the United States. Students will be issued a form I-20 after the University receives all required documents and fees and the student has been accepted by the Admissions Office.


