Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program



WHAT IS THE SCHOLARSHIP?

- ★ The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program enables students of limited financial means to study or intern abroad, providing them with skills critical to our national security and economic prosperity.
- \star The scholarship offers those eligible up to \$5,000.
- ★ The Institute of International Education has administered the program since its inception in 2001.

WHO QUALIFIES?

- \star Must be a citizen or national of the U.S.
- ★ Undergraduate in good academic standing
- ★ Receiving a Federal Pell Grant during time of application
- ★ In the process of applying or accepted into credit-bearing study abroad or internship program
- ★ Must be traveling to travel advisory level 1 or 2 according to the US department of State's travel advisory system

APPLICATION PROCESS?

- Compose your essays first in a word processing program, and then upload the file to your online application. Please use 1-inch margins and Times New Roman 12-point font for each of your essays.
- ➔ Your essay should be composed in paragraph format, not as numbered responses to the questions in the application.
 - The Statement of Purpose Essay is limited to 7,000 characters (including spaces).
 - The Building Mutual Understanding Essay is limited to 3,000 characters (including spaces).
 - → The Follow-on Service Project Proposal is limited to 3,000 characters (including spaces).
 - → The optional **Critical Need Language Award essay** has a 2,000 character limit (including spaces).
- ∋ Ensure that your essays address the prompt/theme.
- Please preview your essays once you have uploaded them into the application to ensure the correct file was uploaded.

APPLICATION PROCESS?

- Official* and Current HCU transcript
- Request at National Student Clearinghouse
- Order a transcript and look up Houston Baptist University
- Fill out information and pay (\$5)

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE ESSAY

- 5 Questions to Ask Yourself:
 - Do you make a connection between your program and goals?
 - Do you make a connection between your country and goals?
 - Do you share how you will be academically successful on your program?
 - Do you give examples of your experience, skills, and knowledge that you will use to meet program challenges?

BUILDING MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING ESSAY


These are question that the Gilman Foundation recommends that you ask yourself in order to write your essay:

- Do you articulate how you will represent the United States as a citizen diplomat while abroad?
- Do you explain how you will contribute to the goal of building mutual understanding?
- Do you discuss how you will look for opportunities to build meaningful relationships and become more culturally engaged?

FOLLOW-ON SERVICE PROJECT ESSAY


This essay is what project you are going to do once you are back from your study abroad trip to complete this requirement:

- Does your FOSP increase awareness of the Gilman Scholarship and study abroad? • Is your project feasible?
- Do you give a detailed plan for your project?
- Do you include your study abroad experience into your project?
- Do you have an intended audience? Who will you collaborate with to reach this community?






BENEFITS FROM BEING A RECIPIENT
