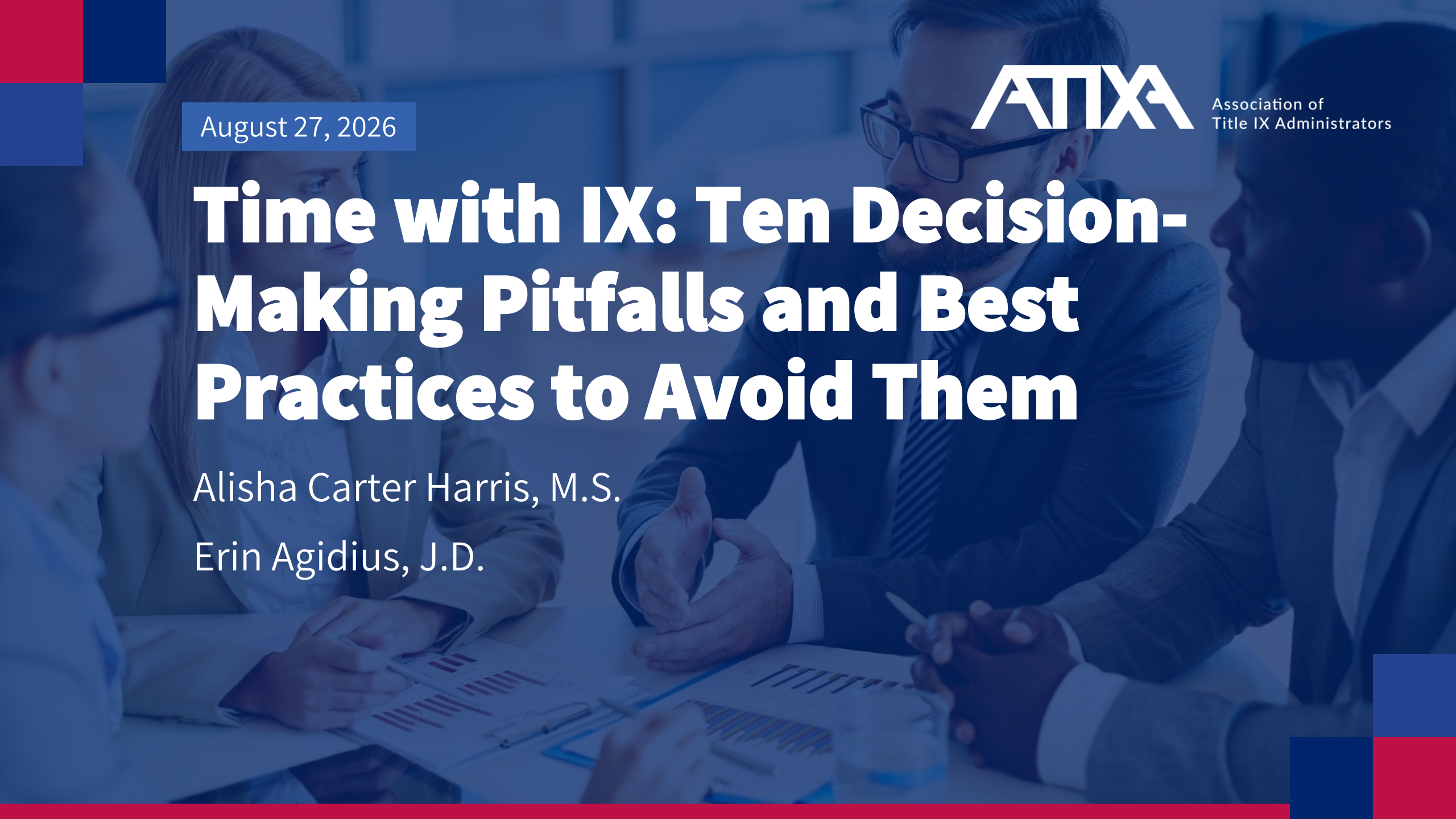

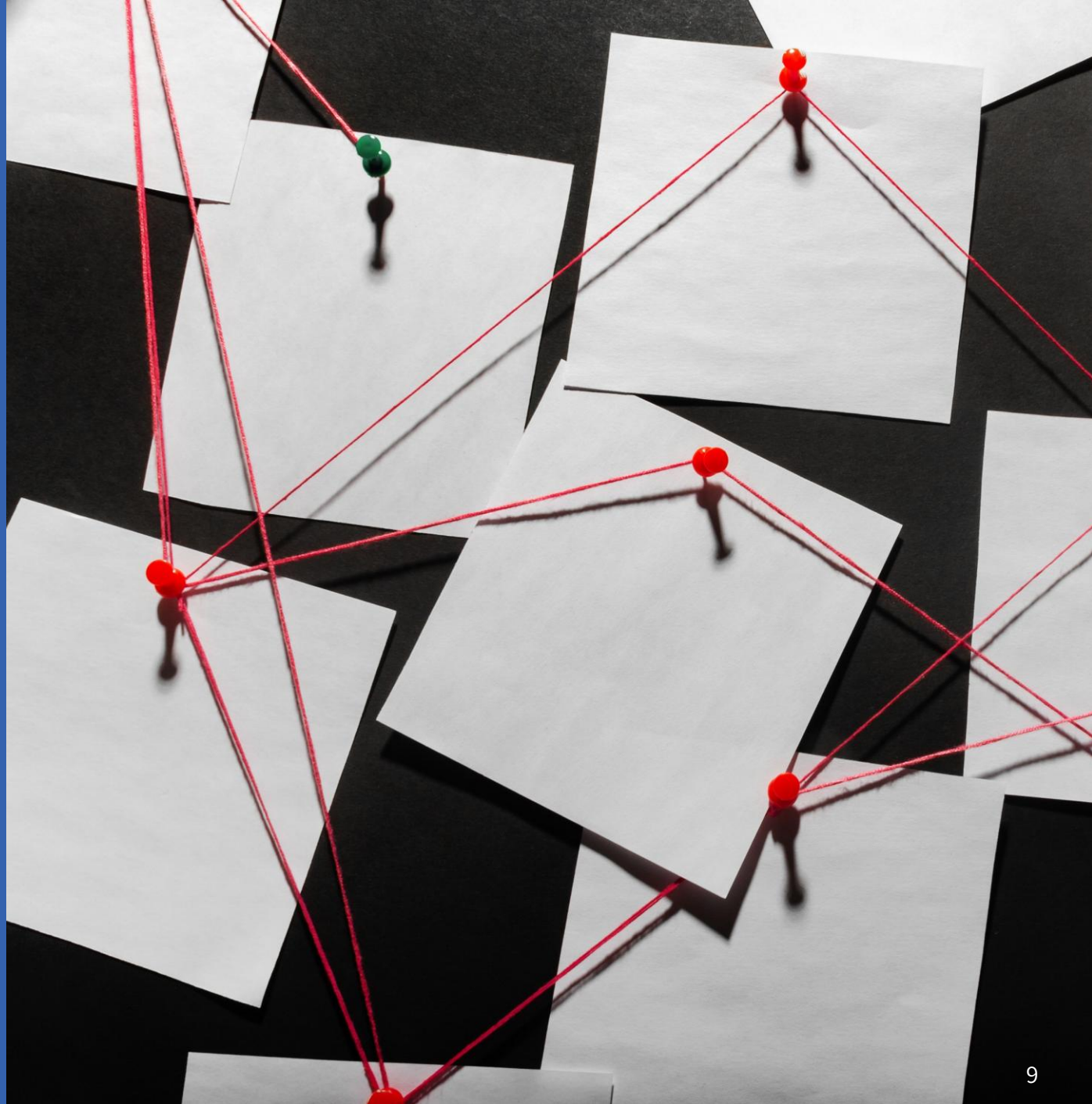

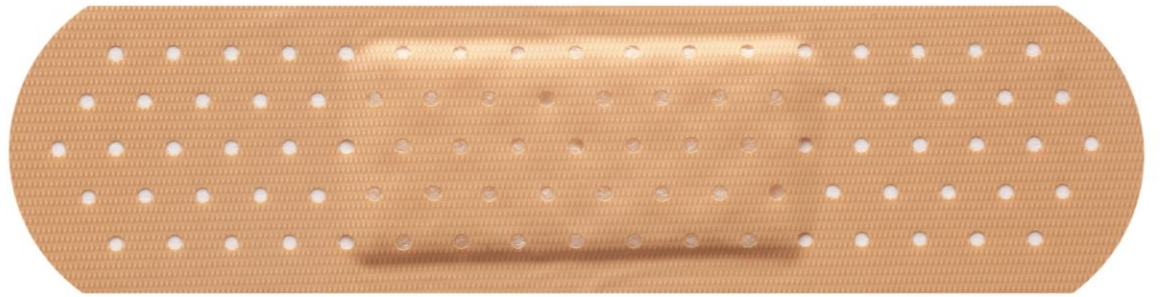

Takeaways

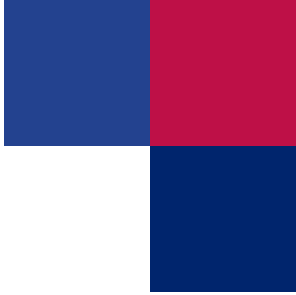
- Each pitfall represents a place where decision-makers take a shortcut...
